

Project-3 Water Treatment Plant

Under Restart NSW Water Security for Regions Programme, Council recently constructed a Potable Water Treatment Plant (WTP) at Rankins Springs at a cost of approximately \$600,000.

Rankins Springs Village has not had potable water in its history. Council's long-term vision and NSW Government funding have allowed this to happen.

This treatment plant is designed to supply potable water within its water boundary including future growth.

To be able to successfully apply and get funding, Council had to also consider the dual system, where public and private parks and gardens remain on existing raw water supply system and potable water for household use only.

Currently, WTP is under a testing phase, where Council employees are taking water samples for the next two months to check and verify water quality against Australian Drinking Water Guidelines (ADWG) values in consultation with PH unit.
